

State of the Region

The Eastern ACPE Region is alive and well. We went over the 1,000 student-units-conducted mark for the first time in 2000, and have averaged 1,034 each year since. The number of accredited centers has hovered in the mid-to-upper forties after peaking at 54 in 1992, and 47 centers are expected to be on line at the end of 2004. Assets at the end of 2003 totaled \$113,408, not enough of a cushion for some and for others much too much!

In addition to gatherings for committee work, peer group support, and ACPE and bi-regional conferences, our Seminars on Supervision and Women Supervising Women events, the continuing legacies of the late Sue Lyon, continue to focus our creativity.

Since the beginning of 2000 we have blessed 19 new Supervisory Candidates, a number of whom are included in those having achieved Associate Supervisor (12) and ACPE Supervisor (13) in this century so far. Furthermore, we received in 2001 five NACC Supervisors whose credentials were recognized by ACPE. These numbers greatly exceed those from retirements and deaths.

We partner creatively in a number of important ways with our sister region, Northeast, though further administrative connections are not in view.
