Self-nominations are acceptable. Emeritus Supervisors must have been active supervisors for ten or more years, must qualify for Retired Supervisor Membership, and must be recommended by the Region.

4. DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

ACPE Distinguished Service Award nominees must have letters of nomination with accomplishments noted, curriculum vita, and other supporting information, to be submitted to RD Jack Gleason easternacpe@aol.com prior to the Administrative Board meeting on April 2.

5. HELEN FLANDERS DUNBAR AWARD

Criteria for the Helen Flanders Dunbar Award are that the woman or man has exercised a leadership role at a critical juncture in ACPE history; or has contributed academic work of great import to the CPE movement; or has had a foundational role in a new expression or direction of ACPE; or has acquired significant financial resources for ACPE. Names, with supporting data, should be submitted to Jack by April 2 as well.
